**Dr. LaVerne Green**

LaVerne Green served as a Nurse Officer in the United States Public Health Service for 28 years, retiring at the rank of Captain. She holds degrees in nursing from Dillard University and William Carey College, and a Doctorate in Nursing Practice, with concentrations in Nursing Education and Health Administration. With a life-long commitment to enhancing the wellbeing of communities, her expertise is in developing, implementing, evaluating, and guiding public health and behavioral health programs, policies, and related legislation, with a focus on minority health, HIV/AIDS, substance abuse, health disparities, and health care reform, and school-based health centers.

Since moving to Bradenton following her retirement, LaVerne she has served on the Easter Seals of Southwest Florida board, becoming chair in 2021. She is a member of the Planned Parenthood board and has served as President of the Bradenton/Sarasota chapter of The Links, Incorporated.

Howard J. Millman was Producing Artistic Director of the Asolo Repertory Theatre from 1995 until he retired in 2006. Prior to rejoining the Asolo in 1995, he was Producing Artistic Director for Geva Theatre in Rochester, New York, Executive Director of Pittsburgh Public Theatre and Managing Director of the Asolo. From 1968 to 1980, he was Guest Director at Pittsburgh Public Theatre, Capital Repertory Theatre, Meadowbrook Theatre Syracuse Stage, Buffalo's Arena, Delaware Theatre, Theatre Virginia, Utah Shakespeare Festival, Stage West, Peterborough Players and the Cape Playhouse.

Howard has directed over 100 plays. He was awarded the Florida Professional Theatre Association's Richard G. Fallon Award for Excellence in Professional Theatre, the Florida Theatre Conference Distinguished Career award and the Sarasota County Arts Council's Arts Leadership Award. He received the Luminaire Award from The Fine Arts Society and the Cultural Champion Award from the Sarasota Arts & Cultural Alliance.
